ONE WAY JOURNEY (OW)

001. WHAT DO YOU MEAN BY "ONE - WAY JOURNEY"?

Origin and the final destination are in different countries. Fares calculated in the direction of travel.

WHEN TO CALCULATE - ONE WAY JOURNEY

002. WHEN WE HAVE TO CALCULATE "ONE - WAY JOURNEY"?

If the itinerary is:-

Not a point to point routing (means itinerary should involve via points)

Or Specified Routing

First (origin) and last (destination) cities should be in different countries and IATA Areas.

HOW TO CALCULATE - ONE WAY JOURNEY

003. HOW WE CAN CALCULATE "ONE - WAY JOURNEY"?

If the itinerary is not a "Point to Point Journey" or "Specified Routing" and route involves via points, you need to collect more than the direct fare from the origin to the destination by using "Mileage Principle Concept".

004. WHAT WE TRY TO FIND OUT IN "MILEAGE PRINCIPLE CONCEPT"?

Mileage Principle involves measuring distances between points and comparing fares to/from intermediate cities to arrive at the correct through fare.

005. WHAT ARE THE BASIC ELEMENTS WHICH ARE INVOLVED IN "MILEAGE SYSTEM"?

- # Maximum Permitted Mileage (MPM)
- # Ticketed Point Mileages (TPM)
- # Extra Mileage Allowance (EMA)
- # Excess Mileage Surcharge (EMS)
- # Higher Intermediate Point Check (HIP)
- # Backhaul Check (BHC)

BACKHAUL CHECK (BHC)

006. WHEN WE HAVE TO CALCULATE "BACKHAUL CHECK" (BHC)?

- # You have carried out Backhaul Check when the fare from Origin to Intermediate Stopover Point is higher than Origin to Destination Point.
- # It is applicable only on One Way Journey

008. WHAT ARE THE "BACKHAUL EXCEPTIONS"?

- # Journeys wholly between the South Atlantic area and Area - 02
- # Journeys wholly within Area - 01
- # Journeys wholly within Europe.
- # Then do not carry out the "Backhaul Check."

MPM Find out the MPM and write along with Global Indicator (GI) 4366 (AT)

TPM Add up the Ticketed Point Mileages and compare the sum with the MPM. 4463

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HOW TO ENTER IN FARE LADDER

024. IN "MANUAL TICKET ENTRY," WHERE WE HAVE TO WRITE DOWN "FARE"?

In "Manual Ticket Entry" enter "Fare" in front of the destination city.

025. IN "MANUAL TICKET ENTRY", WHERE WE HAVE TO WRITE DOWN "HIP" SECTOR?

In "Manual Ticket Entry" enter "HIP" above the fare.

026. IN "MANUAL TICKET ENTRY", WHERE WE HAVE TO WRITE DOWN "EMS" CODE?

In "Manual Ticket Entry" enter "EMS" above the HIP Sector.

027. IN "MANUAL TICKET ENTRY", WHEN WE HAVE TO WRITE DOWN "BACKHAUL"?

In "Manual Ticket Entry" enter "Backhaul" only when you are getting the "Plus Up" amount.

028. IN "MANUAL TICKET ENTRY", HOW WE HAVE TO MAKE "BACKHAUL" ENTRY?

Backhaul Entry

First, enter origin to intermediate stopover point sector

Below that enter origin to destination sector

Below that enter "Plus Up" amount

In front of the "Plus Up" amount, enter in the "Carr" box "P"

029. IN "FARE CALCULATION" BOX, IF WE HAVE TO MAKE LOT OF ENTRIES AND WE DO NOT HAVE ENOUGH SPACE, IN THAT CASE, WHAT WE CAN DO?

Create the space above the fare breakpoint by entering three obliques (///) for the extension city code and two (//) for the extension carrier code.

HOW TO ENTER IN AUTOMATED TICKET ENTRY

030. IN "AUTOMATED TICKET ENTRY", WHERE WE HAVE TO WRITE DOWN ALL THE THINGS?

In Automated Ticket enter after the destination city all the things which are in "FARE CALC" box of "Manual Ticket Entry."
